

Jacques Picard

Jacques Picard is Professor emeritus of Modern and Jewish History and Cultures and Branco-Weiss-Professor of Cultural Anthropology at the University of Basel, Switzerland. Since 2001, he served as the director of the University's Institute of Jewish Studies, since 2010 as co-director of its Institute of Cultural Anthropology, and as a member of the board of directors of the Center of Cultural Topographies. From 2006 to 2012, he had been appointed to be the Dean of Research of the Faculty of Humanities.

In 1996, he had been appointed by the Federal Swiss Government to be a member of the 'Independent Commission of Experts on Switzerland and Second World War' (1996-2001), and has served as the Research Director of the Commission. He had been a member of the Swiss delegation to the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance (IHRA).

He had been a member of the Board of the Simon-Dubnow-Institut für Jüdische Geschichte und Kultur at the University of Leipzig, Germany. Jacques Picard holds now the Chair of the Foundation for Jewish Contemporary History at the ETH Zürich (Swiss Federal Institute of Technology). He is a member of the Paul-Grueninger-Foundation, St. Gallen, and a member of the Scientific Board of the Swiss Journal of Religious and Cultural History (SZRKG), University of Fribourg.
